SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1 Description of first aid measures

General information

Remove contaminated clothing and shoes immediately, and launder thoroughly before reusing. In case of allergic symptoms, especially respiratory tract related, seek medical help immediately.

After inhalation

Rinse the mouth thoroughly with water. Do not induce vomiting. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Seek medical attention.
